It takes ample resources to hire the top-quality teachers and ensemble directors we insist on. It takes regular funding to plan the varied and outstanding educational experiences we're committed to providing. As a young organization, we're still building our long-term financial base, and registration fees for our programs don't cover all our expenses.

Furthermore, if we are to fulfill our mission to make music education accessible to the entire San Diego community, it is essential that we both reduce our reliance on registration fees and generate funds to provide scholarships for those who need them.
